Patsy Byrne, Dundalk.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>FUNERAL REGULATIONS IN THE DIOCESE OF MEATH</u></p> <p>Bishop Michael Smith has written to all priests in the Diocese of Meath in relation to diocesan regulations regarding funerals in the Diocese of Meath. These regulations are to <i>be followed and strictly adhered to at all funerals in the Diocese of Meath</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All priests are to uphold the integrity of the Funeral Mass and Funeral Rites. • Appreciations or eulogies by family members or friends of the deceased should not take place in the Church but may take place after the rite of Committal in the cemetery or when family or friends gather after the burial. • The ambo is for the proclamation of the Word of God. • Readings at the Funeral Liturgy should be taken from the Lectionary. • Secular songs and texts devoid of Christian content are out of place in the Funeral Liturgy. • A post Communion reflection of a prayerful nature can be given after Holy Communion but this should be agreed beforehand with the Priest and should not be used as a cloak for a eulogy • Opportunities to offer sympathy to the family of the deceased should not intrude upon or delay the Funeral Mass.. • Priests will only engage with the family in relation. to the Funeral liturgy • All visiting priests are to be informed of these regulations and asked to abide by them.
